The group is seeking \$49,988 to initiate the pilot phase of the digital programs at the new Chicago Southland Business Incubator. The proposed digital programs aim to support business development and help existing business and prospective small enterprises use digital technologies to transform their business with an emphasis on harnessing the power of ecommerce during the COVID-19 crisis.
